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Europe's twin green and digital transitions carry the promise of more sustainable and inclusive societies. But without intentional design, these transformations risk deepening existing inequalities. The JUST4ALL project responds to this risk with a strong proposition: adult learning and education (ALE) must be placed at the heart of the just transition to ensure that no one is left behind—especially those most at risk of exclusion, such as women, migrants, and lower-skilled adults.

This Policy Toolkit builds on the findings, experiences, and outputs of JUST4ALL to provide concrete guidance for designing policy-coherent adult learning systems that promote fairness, participation, and empowerment. It supports policymakers, education providers, and civil society actors in embedding social justice in ALE policies and practices.

Grounded in a multi-level process of research, dialogue, and co-creation, the Toolkit draws from:



The Just4all Background Papers that framed key concepts and mapped the intersection of adult education with green and digital transitions, migration, and inclusion.



The set of Good Practice Examples collected throughout Europe, highlighting how community learning, inclusive methods, and just transition initiatives are already shaping change.



The JUST4ALL MOOC, an interactive, 8-module course built on these good practices and structured around themes such as social innovation, competences for the future, and participatory governance. Over 100 learners piloted the MOOC, offering rich feedback and engagement.



A structured Policy Roadmap, developed through collaborative reflection and consultation, that outlines strategic directions for integrating ALE into just transition frameworks at local, national, and EU levels.



A series of Policy Events and Webinars, featuring over 25 experts and practitioners, which created space for dialogue and knowledge exchange across sectors.


The Toolkit is divided into thematic areas and tools that can be adapted to various contexts. It includes both tested tools from the MOOC and new tools developed during the project's final phase, along with guidance to build your own processes and apply what works in your reality.

We hope that this toolkit will encourage our collective effort and commitment into action—to support learning not only for skills, but for dignity, participation, and justice.



The JUST4ALL Toolkit is designed not as a rigid manual, but as a dynamic and adaptable resource—one that empowers different actors to take ownership of the just transition through education, advocacy, and policy design. Whether you are a civil society organization (CSO), an educator, or a policymaker, this Toolkit offers practical guidance and ready-to-use tools to support your work in fostering fairer, more inclusive green and digital transitions.

JUST4ALL - MOOC

Just transition is not a one-size-fits-all journey. It unfolds differently depending on local challenges, political priorities, community needs, and available resources. That's why we encourage you to build your own process—by choosing the tools that resonate most with your goals, combining them to suit your strategy, and adapting them as your work evolves.

To support this approach, we've created three tailored pathways—one for CSOs, one for educators, and one for policymakers. Each path includes relevant progressive steps. Every step introduces selected tools from the Toolkit and the broader JUST4ALL ecosystem, including good practices, background papers, and MOOC modules.



Just4All is an EU-funded initiative promoting a just transition through inclusive and innovative lifelong learning and adult education. The action's overall objective is to support an inclusive recovery and digital and green transitions in Europe. More specifically, it aims to develop integrated, inclusive, and innovative adult learning and education (ALE) models that promote just transition, with a special focus on migrants, women, and low-skilled adults. Titled "Building Social Innovation Learning Laboratories in Europe through a Just Transition for All and with All", Just4All is a two-year project running from October 2023 to September 2025.

Why?

Improving adult education curricula, stimulating inclusive debates, and strengthening national and EU policies are all key to enabling Just Transition in Europe, including for women, migrants and low-skilled adults. With strong local and regional buy-in, Just4All will facilitate the implementation of the first principle of the European Pillar of Social Rights (EPSR) on Access to Education, training and life-long learning, and its 20th on Access to Basic Services.

How?

Through this project, SOLIDAR & SOLIDAR Foundation aims to develop new tools, including a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) to promote just transition through far-reaching and inclusive teaching, facilitate access to education and content related to just transition for groups in vulnerable situations including migrants, refugees, asylum seekers, and women, and inform policymakers of the current situation, strengthening policies related to a just transition and facilitating the exchange of information and expertise among practitioners.

Who?

This partnership offers a wide range of expertise in the project's key areas, sustainable platforms for training and peer exchange, as well as a sounding board for new ideas and innovative tools. Together, SOLIDAR, EAEA, and ICAE bring more than 900 Civil Society Organizations from 75 countries in Europe and worldwide, a network with vast opportunities to disseminate the project's results and raise awareness on adult education and just transition.

Energy transition, justice

Short Description

Energy transitions are not solely technological or economic shifts; they have profound social impacts that can either reinforce or challenge existing inequalities. The benefits and burdens of energy transitions are often unevenly distributed, with vulnerable communities frequently facing the greatest risks. A bigger understanding of justice in energy transitions can help reflect on the nature of these issues while identifying new ones along the way. Different ideas of justice can help us better understand what a fair or just transition might mean. The MOOC provides a foundation and set of methods to connect different aspects of energy transitions to justice.

Short Description

The roadmap includes more than 100 specific policy recommendations that will vary in priority, relevance, and applicability depending on local and regional contexts, including current legislation, cultural sensitivities, community-based solutions, levels of consumption and production of animal-sourced foods, and how entrenched industrial animal agriculture is in the region. The tool provides practitioners with the adequate support to embrace the just transition instead of rejecting it.

Short Description

The paper defines and conceptualizes the phenomenon of ‘just transition litigation’, providing a new frame for identifying and understanding the diverse justice claims of those affected by climate action. Meant as a first step to further investigate the phenomenon, the 6-page-paper offers a view to enhancing societal acceptance and support for the transition. These insights are crucial to identify pathways to ensure that climate policies and projects are designed and implemented to protect the rights and legitimate interests of the segments of the population most exposed to the negative impacts of the socio-economic transformations associated with the transition.

Strategic litigation, justice

Short Description

The disturbing trend of systemic abuse of communities and workers in renewable energy value chains has given rise to a tide of strategic litigation by Indigenous Peoples, frontline communities and workers left with no option but to turn to the courts to defend their rights. These lawsuits against renewable energy and transition mineral mining firms result in project delays, “stop orders” and escalating costs - risks which companies and investors can and must avoid through robust human rights due diligence and better project design. This tracking tool aims to be the primary hub for just transition litigation lawsuits against companies undertaking, and/or states authorising, transition mineral mining or renewable energy projects, where rightsholders argue the abuse of human rights and environmental rights.

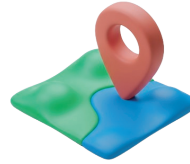
Short Description

The Climate Action Tracker is an independent scientific project that tracks government climate action and measures it against the Paris Agreement aim of "holding warming well below 2°C, and pursuing efforts to limit warming to 1.5°C." The Climate Action Tracker quantifies and evaluates climate change mitigation targets, policies and actions and further develops sectoral analysis to illustrate required pathways for meeting the global temperature goals.

Short Description

The policy brief aims to set out why there cannot be a just transition without rethinking work in Europe more broadly. The cost of not broadening our understanding of a just transition to fully include already existing low-carbon jobs such as care and education is that tensions in Europe's labour market will rise. Other consequences include risks to social cohesion, regional disparities, urban-rural divide, and increasing inequalities. The paper advocates for stronger integration of work/employment, a just transition, and wider environmental policies within the EGD.

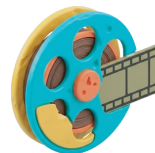
Short Description

Just4All is an EU-funded initiative promoting a just transition through inclusive and innovative lifelong learning and adult education. The actions' overall objective is to support an inclusive recovery and digital and green transitions in Europe. More specifically, it aims to develop integrated, inclusive, and innovative adult learning and education (ALE) models that promote just transition, with a special focus on migrants, women, and low-skilled adults.

Titled “Building Social Innovation Learning Laboratories in Europe through a Just Transition for All and with All”, Just4All is a two-year project running from October 2023 to September 2025.

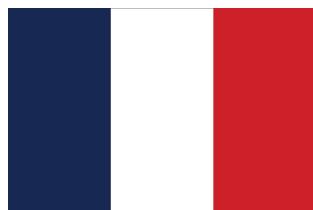

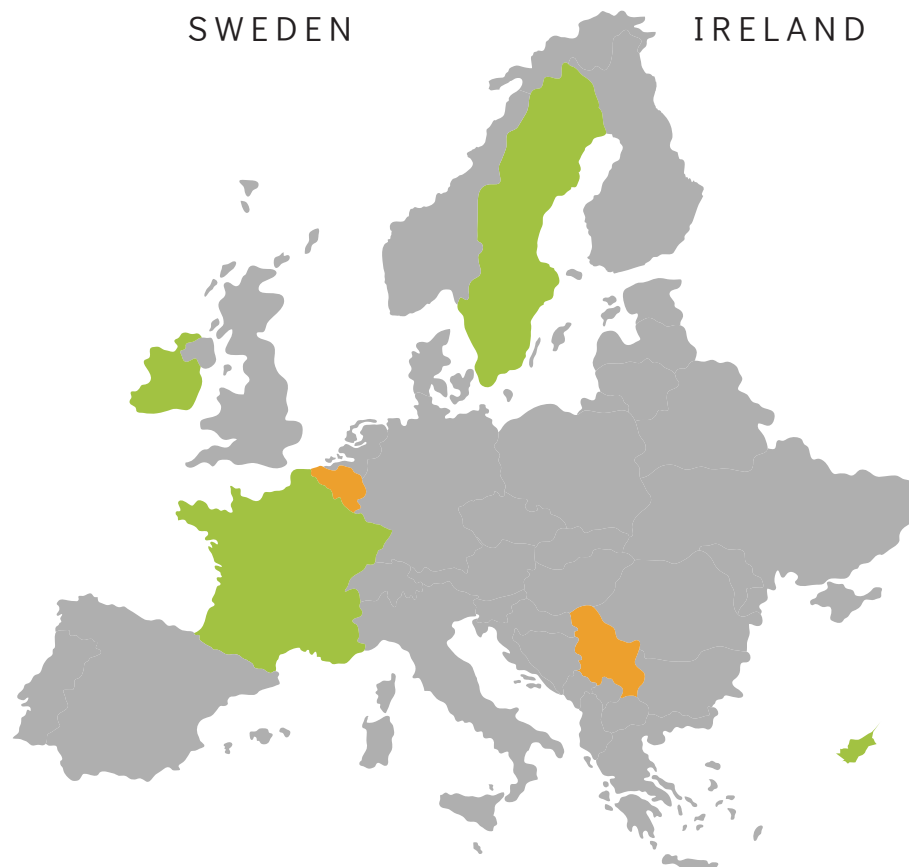
